Adam Swanson - Professional Pianist

Adam Swanson will perform on Friday, June 7th at 1:00 pm in the HS auditorium



Adam Swanson is one of the world's foremost pianists and historians of vintage American popular music, including ragtime, early jazz, the Great American Songbook, and more. Adam has been a featured performer and lecturer at ragtime and jazz festivals across the United States and abroad, and he is the only four-time winner of the World Championship Old-Time Piano Playing Contest. He made his New York debut in Carnegie Hall at the age of nineteen, where he performed with Michael Feinstein. Adam appeared alongside pianist John Arpin at the Bohem Ragtime and Jazz Festival in the Republic of Hungary, and he has also toured Switzerland and Australia. Adam has accompanied silent films at the prestigious Cinecon Classic Film Festival in Hollywood and performed privately for Oscar-winning Disney/Hollywood composer Richard M. Sherman (Mary Poppins, etc.). At the age of twenty-one, Adam performed a solo concert at the Kennedy Center Millennium Stage in Washington, D.C. Adam holds a bachelor's degree in classical piano and a master's in musicology from the Peabody Conservatory of Johns Hopkins University.

Moonlight Serenade Orchestra

Dr. Richardson also performs in the GMBS Big Band and is the instrumental judge for the GMBS Music Scholarship competition. Iowa Military Veterans Band

The Iowa Military Veterans Band will perform a FREE outdoor concert at the Glenn Miller Museum on Sunday, June 9th at 1:00 PM

The Iowa Military Veterans Band "The Only One of Its Kind", directed by James Goodwin, was formed 27 years ago to play for the dedication of the WWII Memorial in Des Moines. The band was so well received that they were encouraged to continue. There are presently about 85 musicians in the band, all former military (Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines, and Coast Guard). They generally perform at military-honoring venues, promoting respect for the military and veterans, in addition to some public performances. They strive to promote the military and patriotism for the U.S. Each year playing at the Iowa State American Legion Convention, the Iowa State Fair, and at the Civic Center, plus other concerts. This past summer they played at the Iowa Municipal Band Festival in Boone and the Pella Tulip Festival. They also play each year for the patients at the Veterans Home in Marshalltown. This concert is in coordination with FREE museum day; plan to visit the Museum and stay for the outdoor concert.



Dennis Spragg - Glenn Miller Collections

Dennis will present his *Long Ago and Far Away* presentation on Saturday, June 8th in the auditorium at 9:30 am



Dennis M. Spragg of the Glenn Miller Collections, American Music Research Center, University of Colorado Boulder, is Glenn Miller's official archivist and biographer. Historian of the Glenn Miller Birthplace Society and festival host, he also produces and hosts the acclaimed weekly big band broadcast, the *Star-Spangled Radio Hour*, directs the Glenn Miller Collections website and social media, and appears regularly on radio, television and podcasts. As an author of critically acclaimed books, including *Glenn Miller Declassified*, he writes respected articles and essays that are widely published by international media including the BBC, Smithsonian, Library of Congress and Voice of America.

Dennis summarizes his presentation - "2024 marks the eightieth anniversary of the most important year of Glenn Miller's career, 1944, and, unfortunately, his disappearance. This year's timely presentation and museum exhibit from the Glenn Miller Collections will capture the sights and sounds of Glenn Miller, 1944, *Long Ago And Far Away* with many rare videos, photos and, of course, the outstanding music of the legendary Glenn Miller Army Air Forces Orchestra."

2024 Glenn Miller Festival Highlights

Friday, June 7th kicks off with the Stage Show, featuring the GMBS Big Band and the scholarship winners at 9:30 am. Adam Swanson entertains festival guests at 1:00 pm, with the Louis Pettinelli Experience at 3:30 pm. The Glenn Miller Orchestra closes the day with their concert at 7:30 pm.

Saturday, June 8th begins early with the Big Band Pancake Breakfast at the Fire Station at 7:00 am featuring the Northwest Jazz Ensemble. The festival moves to the high school for a presentation by Dennis Spragg, *Long Ago and Far Away* at 9:30 am. Next up is Steve Shininger and the ShinSings with a 1:15 pm concert. At 3:30 Ron Ernst and the Moonlight Serenade Orchestra perform in the Auditorium. A highlight of the festival is the catered 'festival dinner' at 5:30 pm with the Glenn Miller Orchestra dance concert and swing dance competition in the Gym at 7:30 pm.

Sunday, June 9th features FREE MUSEUM DAY beginning at 10:00 am at the Glenn Miller Birthplace & Museum. New this year is a second FREE concert at 1:00 pm (outdoors at the Museum) featuring the Iowa Military Veterans Band. Bring your lawn chairs and enjoy the concert.
